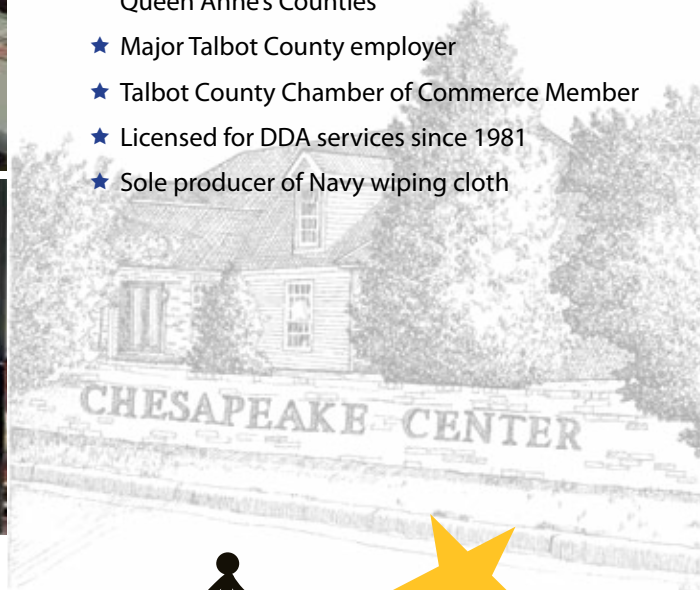

WHAT IS CHESAPEAKE CENTER?

Chesapeake Center is a private, non-profit organization that provides support services, day habilitation, transportation, and residential services to adults with various developmental disabilities, including intellectual disability.

WHAT IS ITS PURPOSE?

The purpose of Chesapeake Center is to provide a comprehensive service system for adults with developmental disabilities in order to promote independence and an integrated life through interaction and association with other individuals and groups in the local community.

WHO IS ELIGIBLE FOR SERVICES?

Any person with a developmental disability who is at least 18 years of age may apply. Some of the more common types of disabilities are physical impairments, intellectual disability, psychiatric disorders, epilepsy, cerebral palsy, and learning disabilities. Contact the Resource Coordinator in your county's Health Department to complete an Eligibility Application.

WHAT SERVICES ARE AVAILABLE?

Support Services, Vocational/Supported Employment, Respite, Residential, and Transportation are the major types of services that are available in Talbot County and adjoining counties.

DAY SERVICES

Chesapeake Center provides active programming in all areas of employment including pre-vocational and vocational training, supported and transitional

employment, and job placement. Training is also provided in other areas of independent living. Services to the public include on-site commercial Bakery Items, Cleaning Services, Car Washing, E-cycling, and Wooden Crab Mallets.

RESPITE

To relieve the daily responsibility of a caregiver, the adult with developmental disability can apply for a short stay at one of the Center's residences. This experience can rejuvenate the caregiver while providing a rewarding experience for the overnight guest. Respite care funding or private pay are accepted.

RESIDENTIAL

Community Living Alternatives range from 24-hour supervision to independent living situations according to the needs of the individual. Chesapeake Center currently supervises over 12 residences in the community. Residents work and/or receive various day services.

TRANSPORTATION

Transportation is provided to and from the day program and the work sites within Talbot County. Transportation is also provided as needed for the residential program including some weekend recreation.
